


FAQ- Technical Questions Player Verification Web Service

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1 Introduction

The aim of this document is to regularly publish answers to questions about technical matters received in the support inbox dgoj.soporteoperadores@meh.es.

2 FAQ Player Verification Web Service

2.1 FAQ 20 October 2011

VerifyChangesRGIAJ. Player records must be compared with the RGIAJ list of banned players every hour and this could represent a massive transmission of records of inactive players.

Section 2.2.2 of the specifications of the Player Verification Web Service explains that for VerifyChangesRGIAJ: "this operation does not require input parameters, as the Operator is authenticated and identified by its digital certificate."

That is, the operator does not have to send its list of players every hour.

The verification service knows the players that have been verified using the VerifyPlayer or VerifyRGIAJ services, and only reports variations to the operator.

2.2 FAQ 11 October 2011

Is it necessary to verify players from the moment the operations begin?

By the ability to send up to 100 players "to be verified", we understand this to mean that the transmission should not be in real time. Pseudo real time? Every day?


The verification service is in real time.

However, if the operator would like to make a query at a later time, the service is left open to allow up to 100 players in a single query.

Is the operator required to recheck the status of the player in the RGIAJ list if it has changed? How often?

Section 2.1.7.1 of the Technical Specifications Document describes how the operator must consult the service <u>every hour</u> to learn of any variation that occurs in the RGIAJ corresponding to players in its records.

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2.3 FAQ 30 September 2011

When will the WSDL of the service be published? (30 September 2011)

We plan to publish it to the working documents page on 5 October 2011.

When will a testing environment for integration into the web service be available?

The expected date of the web service testing environment is 1 November 2011.

What certificates can the operator use to guery the web service?

Certificates issued by any CA are accepted.

Bear in mind that "it shall be the operator's responsibility to notify the CNJ if the certificate used is revoked" (Technical Specifications v0.2, section 5.1.6).
